Voting results on amendment: For 103, against 68, Abstain 13.

So the amendment was approved and the extra paragraph on national sovereignty was included in the resolution, a quite rare event.

Vote on resolution with amendment: For 126, Against 37, Abstain 24

Author's note : The charge for National Sovereignty was led by the ambassador from Singapore he gave the big countries quite a lecture. He was protecting the interest of small countries not to be intimidated by the rich and powerful countries.

The pro/life and pro/family NGOs have always pushed for a strong national sovereignty paragraph especially where there is contentious wording. This has all been part of a strategy to prevent abortion and other nasty sinful things becoming human rights , as they are human wrongs.
